# About the RAF (Regional Americas Fund)

- RAF Purpose is to strengthen the CL/NLP community in Latin America and the Caribbean, and to enhance regional interactions among students and researchers anywhere in the Americas.



# Bank Account Balance Update

- Current bank account balance: \$42,318.27
- No transfers from ACL since the ACL 2020 transfer in May 2022
- Expecting \$191,236 \$21,019 + \$87,951 \$37,376 from conferences
- Not expecting additional 2024 charges from CLO, JSALT, Khipu, RAF, etc.
- No 2025 charges yet
- Recommended minimum balance to offset unexpected loss: \$100,000
- Recommendation: maintain current levels of spending





#### **NAACL Commitment**

# ARR-only submissions

#### Keep working on:

- Building a stable reviewer/meta-reviewer pool
- Maintaining a reliable emergency reviewer pool
- Clear standard on what papers are within scope of \*ACL conferences
- Easier retrieval of previous submissions and reviews
- Standardizing ARR processes for future PCs/EiCs



# ARR — Challenge:

Provide a very large number of good-quality reviews in a short time



# ARR — On having enough reviewing capacity

- Recent cycles: regular reviewer pool woefully insufficient
- How can we have a sustainable system?
  - Since April 2024, ARR has had mandatory reviewing requirements —
    each paper needs to nominate an author who will complete 4 reviews
    - February 2025 (ACL): more reviews required when submitting multiple papers
  - From May 2025 (EMNLP): following ACL Exec suggestion, all qualified authors must review
    - CVPR introduced a similar change
    - Also new reviewer carrots and sticks see blog post for details

# ARR — On having better reviews

- Guidelines thoroughly revised for reviewers and ACs
  - To streamline resubmissions: reviewers discouraged from raising new issues unrelated to changes (unless new reviewers requested)
- Starting in the October cycle review feedback form
  - Authors can flag problematic reviews (not specific enough, unprofessional tone, unreasonable requests, etc.; see <a href="https://aclrollingreview.org/authors#step2.2">https://aclrollingreview.org/authors#step2.2</a>)
  - Issue reports submitted for 10% of reviews
  - Affected AC verdict for 80% of papers with reports
- Stats on reviewers who provide great reviews

# ARR — Updated CFP

- Moved to 10-week review cycle (with ACL Peer Review Committee)
- From October: more detailed instructions to authors
  - Explanation of revisions required for resubmissions
- Tips on how to avoid common problems
